Update: Reports made to the National Anti-Corruption Commission

In response to media interest, the National Anti-Corruption Commission (NACC) provides the following update on the number of referrals received since commencing operation.

In his address on the morning of Monday 3 July, Commissioner Brereton announced there had been 44 referrals made via the NACC's online form since the website had become active on 1 July 2023.

By close of business on 4 July 2023:

- 186 reports had been submitted via the webform at nacc.gov.au, and
- the intake team had taken 116 calls.

Approximately 60 of the referrals relate to matters well publicised in the media.

The Commission won't provide these figures daily but will provide a further update early next week.
