Update: Reports made to the National Anti-Corruption Commission

In response to media interest, the National Anti-Corruption Commission (NACC) provides the following update on the number of referrals received since commencing operations on 1 July 2023.

At close of business Monday 10 July 2023, the Commission had received 311 referrals.

Approximately 54% of the referrals relate to matters well publicised in the media.

As stated by the Robodebt Royal Commission, it has referred parts of its report to the NACC. The NACC will assess these in accordance with its assessment procedures.

It is not appropriate at this stage for the National Anti-Corruption Commission to say more than the Royal Commission has determined to disclose.
