About this report

The *Crimes Act 1914* (Cth) (the Act) provides powers to the National Anti-Corruption Commission (Commission) to support its investigation functions though the authorisation of a controlled operation.

Section 15GD of the Act defines a controlled operation as an operation that:

- involves the participation of law enforcement officers
- is carried out for the purpose of obtaining evidence that may lead to the prosecution of a person for a serious Commonwealth offence or a serious state offence that has a federal aspect
- may involve a law enforcement officer or other person in conduct that would, apart from section 15HA, constitute a Commonwealth offence or an offence against a law of a state or territory.

A major controlled operation is a controlled operation that is likely to:

- involve the infiltration of an organised criminal group by one or more undercover law enforcement officers for a period of more than 7 days
- 2. continue for more than 3 months
- be directed against suspected criminal activity that includes a threat to human life.

The Commission conducts controlled operations in support of its investigations into corrupt conduct involving Commonwealth public officials. By having access and use of these powers, the Commission is required to report every 6 months and annually to the Attorney-General and the Commonwealth Ombudsman on how these powers have been used. This reporting requirement falls under sections 15HM and 15HN of the Act.

This report addresses the annual reporting requirement pursuant to 15HN of the Act and covers the period of 1 July 2023 to 30 June 2024. It has been prepared by the National Anti-Corruption Commissioner, as Chief Officer of the Commission. Copies of the report have been provided to both the Attorney-General and the Commonwealth Ombudsman.

Redactions from the report

Section 15HN(2) of the Act requires the Commissioner to advise the Minister to exclude information from the report that could:

- endanger a person's safety
- prejudice an investigation or prosecution
- compromise any law enforcement agency's operational activities or methodologies.

The Commissioner can also suggest information is removed from the report that would not be in the public interest. The Minister must exclude this information from the report if they are satisfied by the reasoning provided by the Chief Officer.

In accordance with this legislation, information of this nature has been redacted from this report as approved by the Attorney-General.

Quantitative summary

Subsection 15HM(1) of the Act requires that as soon as practicable after 31 December and 30 June in each financial year, the Chief Officer of the authorising agency must submit a report to the Commonwealth Ombudsman setting out the details required by subsection 15HM(2). This information is also to be provided as part of the Annual Report for 2023–24 and is set out in Table 1.
