NACC issues open letter on corruption risks and vulnerabilities ahead of federal election

As Australia approaches the next federal election, the National Anti-Corruption Commission (NACC) has today [issued an open letter](#) to prospective election participants, drawing attention to the corruption risks and vulnerabilities that can arise in the context of an election.

The letter addresses, in particular:

- use of parliamentary resources and staff
- use of official information
- public sector appointments
- grants
- government advertising
- donations and other gifts.

The letter also repeats the Commission's advice that it is inappropriate to announce a referral to the Commission for collateral, including political, purposes.
